The Higher and Degree Apprenticeship Collaboration Group (HDACG)-, made up of Tees Valley Training Providers, Colleges and Teesside University, has been established to collaborate on the expansion of higher and degree apprenticeships on offer within the Tees Valley.

We are working together as a collaborative group to build on our excellent Further Education and Higher Education offer and share good practice in current and future developments in higher and degree apprenticeships.

The group will be identifying existing expertise within the Tees Valley and developing higher and degree apprenticeship (Level 4+) provision where there is highest demand from employers.

The HDACG has produced an e-prospectus which showcases the full range of higher/degree apprenticeships currently on offer.

Higher and Degree Apprenticeships

Like Intermediate and Advanced Apprenticeships, Higher Apprenticeships allow young people and adults to earn while they learn at the highest level & progress into higher skilled occupations.

Higher & Degree Apprenticeships;

- combine work with study
- includes study part-time at college, university or with training provider
- can take between one to four years to complete

Higher and Degree Apprenticeships are available at:

- Level 4 or 5 is equivalent to a higher education certification, higher education diploma or a foundation degree
- Level 6 is equivalent to a bachelor's degree
- Level 7 is equivalent to a master's degree

There are currently 48 Higher Apprenticeships currently available with more in development.

Responsibilities of the Employer

- Minimum of 30 hours a week paid employment
- Responsible for paying an Apprentice. Apprentices are entitled to the apprentice rate of £3.40 if they're either: aged under 19 or aged 19 or over and in the first year of their apprenticeship
- Provide an Induction and training
- Provide Apprentices with the same benefits as other employees
- Provide a contract of employment
- Allow time for off-the job training
- An Apprenticeship agreement must be signed between the Apprentice and Employer
- Support an Apprentice with on-the training
- Be involved in reviewing the progress of an Apprentice
- Ensure all Health and Safety regulations are in place
